Amir (not his real name) is a 27-year-old Christian from eastern Afghanistan, who had a divine encounter with Christ six years ago. He was frustrated in life, due to his failure to get a university admission. He contemplated committing suicide, but God intervened through a dream. Amir saw a man with a radiant face, wearing a white robe and his feet not touching the ground. The man said, "Do not be afraid. Follow me."

That divine encounter led him to Christ, whom he gladly acknowledged as his Lord and Savior. He has followed Him ever since. When his family found out about his conversion, they put pressure on him to revert to Islam, but he refused. At the same time, his 14-yearold sister also accepted Christ.

When the Taliban took over Afghanistan in August 2021, Amir knew it was no longer safe to stay in the country. He took his sister in hopes of going to Pakistan. Unfortunately, he could not bring his sister with him due to safety reasons along the way. He decided to leave her to a trustworthy family so he could return for her later. However, his family found the girl and gave her to the Taliban in marriage.

Amir made it safely to Pakistan. Still angry, his family sent him a message saying that they would come after him and kill him. He said he was not afraid.

He had openly professed his faith since anyone who turns in any Christians. he received Christ, which is why he They are working does not have many friends.

Amir is one of many Afghan Christians, who frantically ran to Pakistan and neighboring countries for safety when the Taliban took over. Many left behind have gone 'underground' to avoid being captured by the Taliban, who have



to eradicate Christianity. Christians are not safe in Afghanistan, but praise God for those who are deeply rooted in the Word. They do not give up their faith despite the terror they are facing. They know where to put their anchor. The light of Jesus shines forth in darkness. Secret prayer meetings continue. As the nation plunges into deeper uncertainties, some Muslim Afghans have grown weary, and their hearts have become open to the Gospel. Although risky, believers reach offered financial compensation to out to them, especially those in rural and mountainous areas.

3(THU) <u>PAKISTAN</u> Pray that trainers will be raised among the seventy trainees, who graduated from the Basic SowH course last month.

5/6(SAT/SUN) <u>CAMBODIA</u> Pray for comfort upon the family of Evelyn, our FEC principal, whose father passed away last month.

16 (WED) <u>SRI LANKA</u> The number increased to thirty-three. 52,021 dengue cases were reported by the National Dengue Control Unit this year. Pray for God's protection of the affected communities .

17(THU) <u>BHUTAN</u> Pray for the Doya Community in southwest Bhutan who requested more leadership training after experiencing church growth within two months after their training.

18 (FRI) <u>BHUTAN</u> Pray against hindrances in conducting discipleship training in eastern Bhutan.

19/20 (SAT/SUN) <u>LAOS</u> Pray for strength, comfort and protection upon believers in Salavan province, in southern Laos, who have experienced heavy persecution recently.

21 (MON) <u>LAOS</u> Pray for our Lao -Chinese brethren reaching out to tribal people in remote places.

22(TUE) <u>LAOS</u> Pray for one of Deen in police custody since June, to be released from prison. Pray against any false accusation. **23**(WED) <u>CHINA</u> Pray for government continues to implement laws restricting citizens.

24 (THU) <u>VIETNAM</u> Pray for church members working in the industrial areas. Many have lost their jobs because their companies have closed.

25(FRI) <u>NEPAL</u> Nepal is said to be the most religious Hindu country in the world. Pray for the people to be free from this evil bondage and see the light of Christ.

26/27 (SAT/SUN) <u>NORTH</u> safely of secret believers who bravely work with foreign organizations, giving pertinent information about situations inside the country.

28 (MON) <u>NORTH KOREA</u> Pray for strength upon Christians who experience double hardship due to food crises and are being hunted for following Christ.
